Blood For The Baron!

Hi, my name is Jim Marshall, I'm the owner, creator and admin for the independent fan sites <u>BloodForTheBaron.com</u> and <u>ActionForceRedux.com</u>. I am the writer and editor for *Action Force Redux* comic, which is created for the G.I. Joe audience. I am seeking a publisher to produce 100 fully-plotted *Action Force Redux* issues, yielding thirty 100-page TPBs, ten 300-page digests and 100 deluxe reprint comics. *Action Force Redux* issues 001, 002, 003, 004 and the first TPB are all ready to print.

Action Force was a miniaturised version of Palitoy's Action Man, designed to complement Kenner's range of 3¾" Star Wars toys. The Action Force toy range was divided into four teams: the military Z Force; naval Q Force; Space Force and the S.A.S. Their enemies were the Red Shadows, an evil terrorist organisation led by the insane Baron Ironblood. Quite aside from his indestructible Mutons and cloned Kraken monsters, the Baron brainwashed his enemies, turning them into mindless slaves!

As part of their long-standing relationship, Palitoy released several Hasbro 12" <u>G.I. Joe</u> toys through their Action Man line. Toys such as <u>Bullet Man</u>, <u>Commander Power</u>, <u>Shield</u>, <u>Gor</u>, <u>Captain Cosmos</u>, <u>Gargon</u>, <u>the Intruder</u> and <u>ROM</u> were added to Palitoy's <u>Space Rangers</u>. When it came to Action Force, Hasbro granted Palitoy the use of several 3¾" <u>G.I. Joes</u>, which were <u>recoloured</u> to fit the assorted teams. The Action Force toys were incredibly popular, as was the comic, *Battle Action Force*.

<u>Battle</u> was an established anthology weekly war comic, sister-title to the sci-fi 2000 A.D. Battle is notable for the gritty, realistic war tales Charley's War, Rat Pack, Major Eazy, Johnny Red, The Sarge, H.M.S. Nightshade, D-Day Dawson and much, much more. On June 4th 1983 Battle began a four-part promotional <u>Action Force</u> comic strip, ahead of the toy release. The story was presented across the double-page centre spreads and back covers, which were the only pages printed in colour.

Due to their instant popularity, five promotional Action Force mini-comics were then released with several Fleetway titles, continuing the story. On October 8th 1983 Action Force joined Battle full-time, changing the cover title to Battle Action Force. With over 20,000 registered Action Force fan-club members, Battle Action Force sales saw a massive surge in new readers.

Sadly, corporate restructuring resulted in Palitoy firing their entire design department in <u>1984</u>. Action Man, Action Force and the Red Shadows were all cancelled overnight. The <u>1985</u> release of Action Force toys were all Hasbro's <u>G.I. Joes</u>, repackaged by Palitoy as A.F. and Cobra, their ranks augmented by factory overstock from the previous Action Force range.

Battle Action Force somehow weathered this chaotic transition with the revolutionary story World Enemy Number One, where Baron Ironblood betrayed his army of Red Shadows to Action Force, then reinvented himself as Cobra Commander. Driven by revenge, Red Jackal hunted him down to his jungle fortress, only to be mockingly remoulded as Destro. The Action Force teams were replaced by Major Flagg's A.F. counter-terrorism unit. Action Force and the Red Shadows were no more.

The 1985 A.F. and Cobra relaunch coincided with the tenth anniversary issue of *Battle Action Force*, dated March 9th 1985. However, even though they were no longer available to buy, Action Force refused to die! Time and again fan-favourites the Red Shadows, the Black Major, Red Laser, Red Vulture and Red Wolf returned to the pages of the new Battle Action Force to fight both A.F. and Cobra at once! The renegade Red Shadows helped soften the blow for their army of disappointed fans.

The last issue of *Battle Action Force* went on sale November 29th 1986, with the culmination of the five-month, grand finale Operation Deep Cover, with A.F. and Cobra going out in a blaze of glory. When Palitoy finally went out of business, their back-catalogue of Intellectual Properties transferred to Hasbro. *Battle* comic soldiered bravely on until January 23rd 1988.

I launched my first Action Force website <u>BloodForTheBaron.com</u> on February 24th 2003. It has only gone from strength to strength, reaching over <u>17,000,000</u> hits per month! I was the sole moderator for the <u>BFTB.UK</u> forum from 2003 to 2013, overseeing many artistic projects. I have worked diligently for the last 22 years to establish the Action Force connection to the G.I. Joe community, confident that there is a huge market just begging for new Action Force and Red Shadows material!

In 2013, I compiled the Action Force Complete Works ten-volume 30th Anniversary compendium of the original Battle Action Force comics. I am also the archivist and graphic designer behind the 300-page Action Force Palitoy Collectors' Guide and Action Force Palitoy Declassified Kickstarter books, as well as the Action Force 30th Anniversary Commemorative Special, Action Force 40th Anniversary Special and the Action Force Palitoy Photobook. I have created a presentation gallery of my self-published, non-profit projects for you here: BloodForTheBaron.com/BFTB. All of my works are available for publication.

Action Force Redux

Action Force Redux is an all-new weekly web-comic and monthly printed title, fully plotted for 100 issues. Written as an anthology, the 24 pages of content are broken down into four six-page strips. With four separate artists assigned six pages a month, deadlines should be easily met. This format provides the layout for the web-comic ActionForceRedux.com. The web-comic is designed to run three weeks ahead of the printed release, so that audience demand would already be primed.

The weekly chapters would be shared across social media. My Christmas 2024 Facebook post received over 30,000 views in one week. This ongoing free promotion would last for the entirety of the printed run. After the 100 monthly issues are finished, *Action Force Redux* could then be reprinted as thirty 100-page trade paperbacks. Enthusiasts will surely want both, as the four concurrent storylines would be rearranged into read-order. Please see the TPB for the finished proof of concept.

The art team I have assembled boasts a strong pedigree: Robert Atkins (G.I. Joe, Action Force: Millerverse, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, Ghostbusters, Tales from the Crypt, Eternal Descent); Mariano A'Q (Masters of the Universe); Rodolfo Valenzuela (Aztec, Loaiza Fortun); Kerowack! (M.A.S.K. '85, M.A.S.K. '86); colourists Simon Gough (G.I. Joe, Transformers, Deathstroke, Savior) and Michael Collins Otu, columnist lan Wheeler (Doctor Who, Crikey!) and cartoonist Alan Schell (Action Force: Millerverse).

The <u>Action Force Redux 001-100 Masterplan</u> magazine is designed as a crash-course in Action Force lore for new readers and prospective publishers, please could you start there? Or you may prefer to watch <u>BloodForTheBaron.com/masterplan</u>. Or, if you would like to read the more thorough project synopsis, please see the <u>Action Force Redux 001-100 Sourcebook</u>. Every one of the 400 chapters is written to both draw the reader in and to move the story along the fully-plotted timeline.

Written to dovetail into the original continuity, *Action Force Redux* issues 001-012 are set during *World Enemy Number One*, to flesh-out the fall of the Red Shadows with a series of prologues, interludes and epilogues. The first story arc also explores the unanswered questions for the original characters who were suddenly <u>conscripted</u> into the new A.F. and Cobra armies.

Issues 013-020 are set among the renegade Red Shadows strips such as Revenge of the Red Shadows and School For Snakes. The fourth story arc is an epilogue set after Battle Action Force, following on from Operation Deep Cover: Battleground. Issues 021-024 then utilise the alternate German Action Force toy line concept for a time-jump! An Anti-Terror Team story set in 2011 serves as both a future preview and as a bonus finale, twenty years after the destruction of the Red Shadows!

With issue 025, Action Force Redux becomes a continuation of the original Battle Action Force story. Issues 025-084 follow a five-year arc in real time; 1987 sees the return of the Red Shadows in Blood Day; but then a Cobra coup in 1988 changes everything; 1989 has the Red Shadows battling Cobra in The Iron War; 1990 unleashes a full-blown alien invasion and 1991 is the climactic battle for Earth itself! Issues 085-096 bring the story full circle by exploring the origins of the main characters. Action Force Redux draws to a close with the four-part finale 'What if Baron Ironblood DIDN'T become Cobra Commander?!'

For the *Battle Action Force* 50th anniversary in 2033, *Action Force Redux* could be repackaged as ten 300-page *Complete Works* books. There is also a fourth print option, which is to rearrange the entire run as *Action Force Redux Delux*e weekly. Every four issues of the original anthology could be split into individual 'artist edition' printings, using the relevant B covers.

Our love of the Red Shadows toys and comics caught on in America, with <u>Devil's Due Comics</u> taking notice of our efforts by <u>reinventing</u> the Red Shadows for their *GI Joe: A Real American Hero* comic. <u>IDW Comics</u> also did the same.

<u>BFTB.UK</u> gained further notoriety with the discovery of the lost Action Force team <u>Special Weapons Force</u>, solving the decade-long <u>Mystery Flash</u> enigma. <u>Hasbro</u> produced a new Red Shadows convention boxset for Joecon 2010.

I have <u>worked diligently</u> for 22 years to <u>establish</u> the Action Force connection to the G.I. Joe fandom, confident that there is a huge market for <u>new Action Force comics</u>. I also have several other fully-realised projects available.

Forever Endeavour

The rock opera of the galaxy! The misadventures of an intergalactic rock band, on a mission to save reality. A multimedia extravaganza incorporating 100 comics and cartoons, ten concept albums, films and graphic novels.
